## **Brief Introduction of Confirmed Lecturers**



Prof. Weixing SHEN, Professor and Dean of School of Law, Tsinghua University. Visiting Scholar at the Faculty of Law, University of Cologne (1999-2000), Senior Visiting Scholar at the Faculty of Law, University of Freiburg (2002), Fulbright Visiting Scholar at Harvard Law School (2009.1-10), Alexander von Humboldt Fellow (2015-2016). The Seventh Award for "National Top Ten Outstanding Young Jurists" in 2014.

Prof. Guobin CUI is a Professor of Law as well as the Director of the Center for Intellectual Property at Tsinghua University Law School. He was the Associate Dean for International Affairs and Academics (2016.7-2019.7). Professor Cui earned his Ph.D. in law, LL.M., and B.Sc. in Chemistry from Peking University, and his second LL.M. from Yale Law School.





Prof. Matthieu Burnay is a Senior Lecturer (Associate Professor) in Global Law at Queen Mary University of London. He is also a Visiting Professor at Beijing Normal University and Paris 1 Pantheon-Sorbonne, as well as an Associate Researcher at the Leuven Centre for Global Governance Studies, University of Leuven.

Prof. Yuejiao Zhang, WTO Appellate Body Former Chair and Judge; Dean of Institute for International Dispute Settlement, Tsinghua University; Professor of Tsinghua University and Director of International Arbitration Programs (IADS); International trade expert appointed by the President of China's Supreme Court; Arbitrator of ICSID, ICC, LCIA, CEITAC, BIAC and HKCIA. Prof. Zhang specializes in International Economic law including Foreign Investment Law; International Trade Law; Company Law; Contract Law; Intellectual Property; Project Financing; Banking Law; WTO law and Dispute Settlement.





Prof. Malgosia Fitzmaurice holds a chair of public international law at the Department of Law, Queen Mary University of London. Since 2019 she has been elected an Associate Member of the Institue de Droit International and in 2021 she was awarded the Doctorate Honoris Causa of the University of Neuchâtel. She specialises in international environmental law; the law of treaties; and indigenous peoples. She publishes widely on these subjects. Professor Fitzmaurice was invited as a Visiting Professor to and lectured at various universities, such Berkeley Law School; University of Kobe; Panthéon-Sorbonne (Paris I).

Prof. Bin LI got his Bachelor and Master degrees in law from Nankai University (Tianjin, China), and has the diploma of Doctor of Law from the University Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne (France) and currently is Professor, Vice-Dean of the Law School of Beijing Normal University (China). Bin Li was research fellow of the Nantes Institute for Advanced Studies (2011-2012). His doctoral thesis deals with the protection of property right in China. The main research themes cover land tenure, private property and social inequality, relationship between property and responsibility.





Prof. Xinjun ZHANG is a Professor of Public International Law at Tsinghua University, Beijing. His research interests include the Law of the Sea, International Environmental Law, Non-proliferation Law and the Law of Treaties. He is the Executive Director of the Center for the Law of the Sea Study in Tsinghua Law School.

Dr. Kevin LUO is an Assistant General Counsel of Microsoft and is also the General Manager of the Legal Department of Microsoft's Asia R&D Group. Prior to his current responsibility, Dr. Luo was the General Manager of Government and Corporate Affairs for Microsoft China. Prior to joining Microsoft China, Dr. Luo worked in Microsoft's headquarters in Redmond, Washington, US from 1999 to 2011, in various capacities including Associate General Counsel for Patents for Microsoft's Server and Tools Business, Director of IP Licensing, Senior Licensing Counsel, and the lead patent attorney for Windows Division.





Prof. Hong XUE is the law professor of Beijing Normal University, the member of the Advisory Committee of the United Nations Network of Experts for Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific (UNNExT) and the member of the Expert Council of APEC E-Commerce Business Alliance.

Prof. Marina Timoteo is full professor of Comparative Private Law at the University of Bologna, where she also teaches Asian Law and Law and Business in China. She lectured and has been appointed as a Visiting professor at People's University and Beijing University, Chuo University of Tokyo, China's University of Political Sciences and Law. She is the University of Bologna delegate in the General Assembly of China-Europe School of Law of Beijing.





Prof. Niovi Vavoula is Lecturer (Assistant Professor) in Migration and Security at Queen Mary University of London (School of Law) since 2018. She holds an LLM in European Law and a PhD from Queen Mary University of London. She publishes in the areas of EU Immigration law, EU Criminal law and Privacy law and has acted as an expert consultant for the EU institutions and NGOs.

Dr. Xiqing TIAN, Juris Doctor/Postdoctoral Researcher, Associate Research Fellow, Senior Legal Expert of Alibaba Group Legal & Compliance Department, Senior Researcher of Alibaba Legal Research Center, Council member of Network and Information Law Institute of China Law Society, and Young Expert of Internet Society of China.

He is an assistant country reporter for China at the CELIS Institute, Berlin. He is a member from Erasmus University Rotterdam of the Asia-Pacific and Europe Law School Alliance (APELIA). Dr. Bian's research area covers international investment law, international investment dispute resolution, China's foreign investment law, and comparative law.

Prof. Jan Wouters is a Full Professor of International Law and International Organizations, Jean Monnet Chair *ad personam*, Director of the Institute for International Law and of the Leuven Centre for Global Governance Studies (a Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence and University Centre of Excellence) at KU Leuven, President of the University's International Policy Council, and Administrator of the America Europe Fund. He is Adjunct Professor at Columbia University (New York), and Visiting Professor at Sciences Po (Paris), LUISS (Rome), and the College of Europe (Bruges). A Member of the Belgian Royal Academy and *Of Counsel* at Linklaters, Brussels, he has published widely on international and EU law, international organizations and global governance, and corporate and financial law.





Prof. Guohua YANG is a professor at Tsinghua University Law School. He is a WTO Appeal Arbitrator and the Executive Vice Chairman at WTO Law Research Society of China Law Society (China WTO Law Society). He was also IP attaché at Chinese Embassy in the United States, Washington, DC (2006.1-2008.9) and WTO Appellate Body member candidate (2016). When he was working in the Chinese Ministry of Commerce from 1996-2014, he participated in the negotiations on China WTO accession and drafting the Accession Protocol and Working Party Report; he was the first Director and later Deputy Director General for WTO Legal Affairs within the Ministry responsible for WTO cases related to China.

Prof. Wenwei GUAN is the Associate Professor at the School of Law, City University of Hong Kong. Arbitrator of the South China International Economic and Trade Arbitration Commission; Central IRB Member, Hong Kong Hospital Authority Central Institutional Review Board. Research interests cover intellectual property, international trade, and PRC trade and investment.





Prof. Shujie FENG is associate professor of Tsinghua University. He has got his Ph.D. in University Paris I - Pantheon Sorbonne, LL.M. in Renmin University of China and LL.B. in Shandong University. He is Vice-President of Beijing Intellectual Property Judicial Protection Association, expert Council member of China Trademark Association, visiting professor of University of Milan, University of Toulouse I, University of Paris I, University of Paris Saclay, Max Plank Institute for Procedural Law and Strasbourg University CEIPI. His research and teaching area is intellectual property law. He has published two books and more than 40 articles in Chinese, English and French in Journal of World Trade, World Trade Review, QMJIP, IIC, EIPR, Propriété Industrielle, etc.

Prof. Tianxiang HE is Assistant Professor at the School of Law, City University of Hong Kong. Dr. He holds an LL.B. degree (Huaqiao University, China, 2007) and a Master degree in International Law (Jinan University, China, 2009). Dr. He received his degree of Ph.D. in IP law at Maastricht University (the Netherlands, 2016), where he was Researcher at the Department of International and European Law, and Ph.D. Fellow at Institute for Globalization and International Regulation (IGIR), and another Ph.D. degree in Criminal Law at Renmin University of China (2017).
