Multi-Faith Provision

The Union is continuing to receive significant pressure from Islamic students to provide a space for Friday Prayer. After meetings with Estates & Facilities, there has been further delays in using the Great Hall as several Health and Safety Concerns have been raised. A meeting took place recently where it was highlighted that the space available in the Great Hall is now further limited, which suggests that the Great Hall may not be able to accommodate the number of staff and students who require the space for Friday Prayer.

The Union would like to thank Professor Rebecca Lingwood with her continued support on this, however, it has been somewhat concerning that there has been great delay in correspondence from Estates & Facilities regarding the updates on the Great Hall, impacting the use of this space throughout both Term 1 and 2 of this academic year.

The Union would like QMUL to find a permanent solution for the start of semester 3 and for future years to prevent this ongoing issue which is leading to student and staff dissatisfaction.

The annual QMSU Elections took place from 7-10th March 2016, where the Executive Officers, Student Trustees and Student Council for 2016/2017 were elected. The total number of voters was **3759** with a total number of **47051** votes were cast. This year was one where a great number of the positions available were heavily contested, with some part-time officer positions being contested by up to 7 students. This was seen in particular by students running for the BL specific part-time officer positions.

QMUL Students to lead on Graduate Centre Café name

The Union is greatly looking forward to facilitating a student competition in order to name the new café that will be present in the new Graduate Centre, opening January 2017. This competition will encourage students studying at QMUL to name the new café, and to increasingly feel part of this great project on campus.

QMUL/QMSU Sports Strategy Task & Finish Group

A QMUL/QMSU Joint Sports Strategy Task and Finish Group has been set up. The group is being chaired by Professor Rebecca Lingwood, and is tasked to review the previous joint Sports Strategy 2010-2015, in order to draft a new strategy by autumn 2016.

The Strategy has been primarily focused on growth in participation levels and opportunities to access physical activity. It was reported that participation levels increased by 66% from 4426 participants within sport in 2010/2011, to 7345 participants in 2014/2015, and increasing attendances by 46% from 148,545 in 2010/2011 to 217,181 in 2014/2015. There has also been a significant increase in the number of coaches and officials from 178 in 2010/2011 to 504 in 2014/2015.

QMUL/QMSU Lad Culture Working Group

A QMUL/QMSU Lad Culture Working Group has been set up to review current policy regarding Lad Culture on campus, specifically looking at anti-social behaviour and sexual harassment, and the information that is provided both by the University and the Union regarding the reporting of these incidents, as well as information made available. The first meeting will take place on the 26th April and is due to be completed by June 2016.

Annual Survey

Our annual survey has now been launched and incentives have been offered to those completing the survey. This survey provides the Union with valuable information to monitor our progress and plan for future years.

General comments

The 2016 Queen Mary, University of London Students' Union elections were conducted by the elections team and Deputy Returning Officer from QMSU in accordance with the articles of association and bye-laws. They are overseen by an impartial third party Returning Officer from NUS. The Deputy Returning Officer has deemed the elections free and fair for voters with the complaints and evidence presented. This means voters were able to vote freely and fairly in this election.

This year has seen the Unions highest ever voter turnout of 3759, which is 187 more cast than in 2014. We received 13 nominations for the four Executive positions, which is less than in 2015. Student Council was considerably more contested, with 24 of 35 contested (in 2015 it was 14 of 35).

Some posts are still unfilled and the Union will need to run a by-election in September/October for the First Year Representative and Postgraduate Taught Representative on both campuses. This is required as we cannot elect these positions before they arrive.
